

At the end of May 2021, there were 2,270 claimants for unemployment insurance in the Saugeen catchment area -Up 1400 (161%) from May 2020. By comparison, there was a 327% increase Ontario-wide.



ISSUED PERMITS ON THE RISE


The value of building permits issued at the end of the first half of 2021 was reported at \$292 million, Up \$149 million or 104% from the first half of 2020.






PRICES CONTINUE TO SURGE UPWARDS

The first half of 2021, the number of homes sold totaled 1.829 units, up 42% from same period in 2020. The average price of homes sold during 1st half of 2021 was \$632,067.12, up 44.3 % from same time period in 2020. The total value of Agricultural properties sold between Jan and Jun of 2021 is \$83 million, up 114% from the same period in 2020.



In the first half of 2021, the average caseloads were reported as 1158. This represents a decrease in caseloads by 34% when compared to the same time period in 2020.
