


Hawks' Nest May 17th, 2023 at the Roxy Theatre Owen Sound, ON.



2022 ended with a rise in cost of living, leading to economic indicators performing weaker than predicted, pushing the Consumer Price Index higher with inflation and interest rates. High inflation reduced consumer spending on non-necessities, focusing their budgets on health, education and transportation costs as per Bank of Canada. The outlook for 2023 could be much the same if rates continue to climb.

The average number of claimants dropped


In 2022, the average number of claimants for employment insurance totaled 864, a decrease of 1159 claimants on average per month or 57% when compared to the average monthly number of claimants in 2021.



New Motor Vehicle Sales


Local sales slow down

The annual number of total vehicle sales for 2022 increased by 19 units or 0.4% when compared to the number of units sold in 2021. By comparison, Ontario-wide sales had a 5% decrease or 33,000 units over the same time period.





In 2022, a Bank of Canada survey that took place between October 27 and November 17, 2022 with follow-up interviews in November and December 2022, shows that a growing share of consumers plan to continue reducing their spending or to postpone purchases because of elevated inflation and interest rates.



Building Permits Saugeen

Number of permits & values inflates

The value of building permits (which include residential, commercial, and agriculture) issued at the end of 2022 was reported at \$605 million, up \$100 million or 20% from the same time period last year.






In 2022, residential sales totaled \$1.66 billion – Down \$625 million from 2021. The average price of homes sold in December 2022 was \$646,461, a drop of 22% from December 2021. Home sales in 2022 totaled 2,385 units. This was a decrease of 1,118 units or 32% over 2021. The total value of agriculture sales for 2022 was \$141 million – down \$6 million (4%) over 2021.

Caseloads climb

The average number of caseloads in 2022 was reported to be 2051. This represents an increase of 335 caseloads or 20% when compared to 2021.
